

REDUCE SLIPS, TRIPS AND FALLS



MRFs are dangerous places to work. We know it's easy to get distracted or hurry to get to a break or to leave at the end of your shift. Don't let that happen! You are at risk for serious injury from slips, trips and falls.



Be sure to use 3 points of contact and remain alert on ANY stairway you're on — at your apartment, the store or the ballpark. We want you to LiveSafe away from work too!!

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Housekeeping. Any time you have two pieces of paper together, you create a slip hazard. Material left on the floor or on stairs is an issue. The baling area can also be especially dangerous because of how wet and slippery the floor can become. Keep your work area clean.
- 2. Pay attention. Your brain has to be turned on from the second you arrive until the moment you leave the plant at the end of your shift. You need to think Safety First.
- **3.** Follow the rules (like 3 points of contact) when you are using stairs. Look for signs or yellow painted areas that tell you a hazard is present.
- **4.** Look for hazards throughout your shift. Anything you identify becomes a repair priority for the day. *If you see something, say something.*

It takes **teamwork** to keep each other safe. Preventing slips, trips and falls has to be top-of-mind for everyone, every day.
